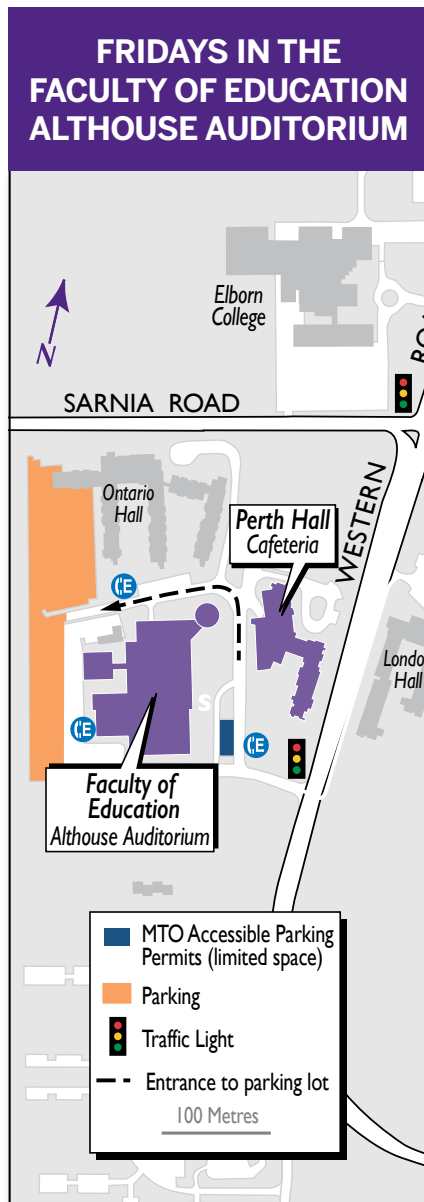
Parking
